These lockdown safety buckets would offer specific emergency materials to help all students and staff within our district to be prepared for any unexpected emergency that would cause our school to lockdown for an extended period of time. He needs buckets for 70 classrooms that will cost between \$3500.00 and \$5000.00. He will get detailed estimate. Also, Katelynn Amendolera will send letters to area businesses to see if they can donate as well.
